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POPULATION AND INCOME ESTIMATES FOR CITIES IN UTAH

The Census Bureau recently completed July 1, 1984 population estimates and calendar year 1983 per capita money income estimates for all incorporated cities in the state of Utah. These estimates are used in the Federal Revenue Sharing program and for the Utah State B and C Roads program. To the extent possible, the population estimates reflect revisions made during the Census Bureau's review of the figures with local officials.

A comparison of the July 1, 1984 population estimates with the April 1, 1980 census counts reveals which cities in Utah are experiencing the greatest population growth. According to the Census Bureau's population estimates, the five largest cities are; Salt Lake City (164,844), West Valley City (89,147), Provo (74,138), Ogden (68,183), and Sandy (63,498). When West Valley City was incorporated in 1980 it was Utah's third most populated city, but with an estimated increase of 16,638 inhabitants from 1980 to 1984 it surpassed Provo to take second place. Only two other cities had increases of more than 10,000 inhabitants during this four year period; West Jordan with an increase of 11,558 persons and Sandy City with an increase of 11,288 persons.

Of Utah's 226 incorporated cities, only 11 had decreases in population from 1980 to 1984. There were 3 cities with populations greater than 1,000 inhabitants that experienced declines; Moab (-242), Monticello (-40), and Sunset (-30).

In terms of percent increase, five cities grew more than 50 percent from 1980 to 1984. The five fastest growing cities with their percent increases were; Leamington (76%), Hinckley (65%), Oak City (57%), Delta (57%), and Holden (52%). These cities are all in Millard County. Their rapid growth was primarily due to the construction of the Intermountain Power Project (IPP). With construction nearly completed this area will experience some population loss, as the existing economy and operation of IPP will not support the current population level.

For large cities, those with 10,000 or more inhabitants, the five fastest growing and their percent increases from 1980 to 1984 were; West Jordan (42%), Saint George (26%), West Valley City (23%), Sandy City (22%), and Clearfield (22%).

To estimate the population of each incorporated city, a component procedure was used in which each of the components of population change (births, deaths, net migration, and special populations) was estimated separately. These components of change cover the time period from April 1, 1980, base population to determine a July 1, 1984, estimate. This procedure is known as the Administrative Records method. For most areas, the base population is identical to the published April 1, 1980, census count. Differences from the 1980 counts are generally the result of census corrections or annexations.

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Per Capita Income Estimates

Per capita income (PCI) figures are the estimated average amount per person of total money income received during a calendar year for all persons residing in a given city. The estimates are based on the 1980 census and have been updated using rates of change developed from various administrative record sets and compilations, mainly from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and the Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA).

The per capita income estimates are based on a money income concept. Total money income is defined by the Bureau of the Census for statistical purposes as the sum of:

- Wage or salary income
- Net nonfarm self-employment income
- Net farm self-employment income
- Interest, dividends, and net rental income
- Social Security and railroad retirement income
- All other regularly received income such as Veterans' payments, pensions, unemployment compensation, and alimony.

Receipts not counted as income include various "lumpsum" payments such as capital gains or inheritances. The total represents the amount of income received before deductions for personal income taxes, Social Security, bond purchases, union dues, Medicare deductions, etc.

For cities with more than 2,500 inhabitants:

- the five with the largest per capita incomes in 1983 were: Park City (\$15,718), South Ogden (\$9,606), Salt Lake City (\$9,268), Bountiful (\$9,144), and Murry (\$9,113). This compares with a per capita income figure of \$7,668 for the entire State of Utah in 1983.

- the five with the smallest per capita incomes in 1983 were: Washington (\$4,794), Blanding (\$4,824), Santaguin (\$4,841), Ephraim (\$4,844), and Hurricane (\$5,240). These range from 63% to 68% of the state figure of \$7,668.

- the five with the largest increases in per capita incomes from 1979 to 1983 were: Park City (\$2,980), Tremonton (\$2,037), Sandy City (\$1,921), Brigham City (\$1,871), and South Ogden (\$1,868). The increase for the state as a whole from 1979 to 1983 was \$1,363.

- the five with the largest percent increases in per capita income from 1979 to 1983 were: Tremonton (35%), Delta (31%), West Point (30%), Brigham City (30%), and Fillmore (30%). Sandy City also increased by 30 percent. Per capita income increased 22 percent for the state as a whole during this four year period.

On the following four pages are July 1st population estimates for 1982 and 1984, as well as the April 1, 1980, Census. There are also per capita income estimates for calendar years 1979, 1981, and 1983. These estimates are presented in the table in county order, with all incorporated cities in each county listed in alphabetical order. When cities fall in more than one county, each county piece is marked with an asterisk (*), and totals for these cities are presented at the end of the table. After the estimates are presented for all the cities in a given county, estimates are provided for the remainder or balance (balnc-) of the county.

Note: the Utah Population Estimates Committee has examined the 1984 Bureau of the Census Estimates at the state and county levels and has found them to be significantly higher in most cases than those prepared by the committee. This may affect or distort the estimate for a given city. If you have any questions concerning these data please call.

ONGOING 1990 CENSUS GEOGRAPHY PROGRAMS

The Census Bureau is now working with state and local government officials on several programs to define geographic areas for the 1990 Census of Population and Housing. The Utah State Data Center, Office of Planning and Budget, sponsored a one-half day informative meeting last December 13th with county officials and planners. The primary purpose of the meeting was to explain and help coordinate the participation of all levels of government in Utah in three Census Bureau programs: the Block Boundary Suggestion project, the Census Tract program, and the Block Numbering Area program.

The Block Boundary Suggestion Project — A major requirement for the 1990 Census is to provide each state with population counts for legislative reapportionment/redistricting purposes. All counties in the state have been invited to suggest visible ground features that the Census Bureau will consider using as boundaries for census blocks in 1990. To the extent counties suggest as block boundaries those features that bound current or expected voting districts (VTDs), the task of aggregating the 1990 census block population counts to the level of VTDs or VTD equivalents is made easier and more accurate. It should be noted that all of the geographic area of each state will be contained within mutually exclusive census blocks; whether that be a city block or a relatively large rural area circumscribed by roads, streams, railroad tracks or other visible features.

All census block boundaries will be entered into the Census Bureau's computers. Prior to the 1990 Census each county in Utah will be provided with a computer generated map showing all the census blocks in their county. County officials then can delineate boundaries around groups of whole census blocks comprising their VTDs on these block maps. The Census Bureau then includes these VTD lines in its 1990 geographic system and will provide each county with redistricting counts for VTDs, VTD equivalents, other standard census tabulation areas, and census blocks in 1991.

The Census Tract Program — There will be six counties in Utah that have census tract boundaries for the 1990 census; Cache, Davis, Salt Lake, Tooele, Utah, and Weber counties. County planners and local data users in these counties are organized into census statistical areas committees and given the opportunity to establish census tracts or to revise or subdivide 1980 census tracts for use in the 1990 Census of Population and Housing. Census tracts are small, relatively permanent geographic divisions of counties defined by local census statistical areas committees for the purpose of presenting statistical summaries. Census tracts generally have between 2,500 and 8,000 inhabitants and are socioeconomically homogeneous at the time of their delineation. Ideally, the boundaries of census tracts remain the same for a long period of time, making it possible to compare statistics for the same geographic area from census to census.

The Block Numbering Area Program — The purpose of this program is to provide the framework for numbering 1990 census blocks for the 23 counties in Utah that do not have census tracts. Block numbering areas (BNAs) are similar to census tracts, however, because they are defined in "non-metropolitan" counties, their boundaries tend to change more from census to census compared to the relatively permanent boundaries of census tracts. The Utah State Data Center is responsible for the BNA program. We are currently working with local government officials to define the BNA boundaries in each of the "non-tracted" counties.

Deadline of June 30, 1986 — The deadline for submitting suggestions and plans for the three 1990 Census geography programs by state and local government officials to the Bureau of the Census is June 30, 1986. The Census Bureau must receive all local input by June 30th to ensure that related geographic preparations proceed in a timely manner. The Census Bureau will not grant extensions beyond this deadline. If you have any questions concerning any of the 1990 Census geography programs please call 533-6082.
