2006 Subcounty Population Estimates

The U.S. Census Bureau released July 1, 2006 subcounty population estimates on June 28, 2007. The report includes estimates for 19,475 incorporated places in the nation, 240 in Utah, as well as the unincorporated balance of counties.

Nation

According to U.S. Census Bureau population estimates for July 1, 2006, North Las Vegas, Nevada was the fastest growing large city (population of 100,000 or more) in the nation with a growth rate of 11.9% from July 1, 2005 to July 1, 2006. All of the cities in the top ten were in the South or the West. Also, many of the cities, such as North Las Vegas, are suburbs of larger nearby cities. McKinney, Texas had the nation's second fastest growth rate (11.1%) among large cities between July 1, 2005 and July 1, 2006. It was followed by Port St. Lucie, FL (9.9%); Cape Coral, FL (8.1%); and Gilbert, AZ (7.8%). Rounding out the top ten fastest growing large cities in the U.S. are: Grand Prairie, Texas; Peoria, Arizona; Cary, North Carolina; Denton, Texas; and Lancaster, California.

Phoenix, AZ, once again had the largest numerical population increase between 2005 and 2006, adding 43,192 people. It was followed by San Antonio, TX (33,084), Fort Worth, TX (30,201), Houston, TX (26,554), and North Las Vegas (21,040).

New York City continued to be the nation's most populous city, with 8.2 million residents. This is more than twice the population of Los

Angeles, which ranked second at 3.8 million. It was followed by Chicago (2.8 million), Houston (2.1 million), and Phoenix (1.5 million). Phoenix moved up to fifth most populous replacing Philadelphia which moved to sixth place with just under 1.5 million.

Utah

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Herriman had the highest growth rate from 2005 to 2006 for cities with a population of 5,000 or more. It grew at a rate of 30.3% and was followed by Cedar Hills (11.9%), Lehi (11.1%), Washington (11.0%), and Riverton (10.6%).

South Jordan experienced the largest numeric growth with an increase of 3,800 persons, followed by Lehi (3,591), Riverton (3,420), Herriman (3,405), and St. George (3,249).

Salt Lake City continued to be Utah's most populous city with a population of 178,858, followed by West Valley City (119,841), Provo (113,984), West Jordan (94,309), Sandy (94,203), and Orem (90,857).

With the release of the 2006 estimates, one of Utah's incorporated places changed the class of city in which they are grouped. Pleasant Grove (30,729) moved from a fourth class city to a third class city.

Houses are Getting Larger in Utah and the United States

According to a report recently released by the Census Bureau, houses in the U.S. are becoming larger when measured by how many bedrooms they have. In 2005, 20.0% of occupied houses in the U.S. had four or more bedrooms, up from 17.7% in 2000.

National Data

Utah continued to have the highest percent of large houses in the nation, with 39.2% of existing houses having four or more bedrooms. It was followed by Maryland (28.0%), Virginia (26.5%), Colorado (26.2%), Minnesota (26.2%), North Dakota (26.1%), and Delaware (25.8%).

Of the new one-family houses completed in the U.S. in 2005, 39.4% had four or more bedrooms, compared to 35.0% in 2000. Nearly half (44.6%) of the houses built in the West had four or more bedrooms; followed by the South (40.3%), Northeast (35.6%), and Midwest (31.6%).

Over the five-year period, the average square footage of new homes built in the U.S. increased from 2,266 in 2000 to 2,434 in 2005, a 7.4%

increase in size. The Northeast had the largest houses, averaging 2,556 square feet. It was followed by the South (2,463 sq ft), the West (2,434 sq ft), and the Midwest (2,310 sq ft).


Among counties with populations above the 65,000 threshold in the American Community Survey, Davis County, UT had the highest percentage of houses with four or more bedrooms (49.4%), followed by Forsyth County, GA (48.5%), Utah County, UT (45.7%), Fayette County, GA (45.5%), Loudon County, VA (44.6%), and Stafford County, VA (43.8%).

Among cities with populations above 65,000, Sandy, UT ranked first in percentage of houses with four or more bedrooms (64.6%), followed by Sugar Land, TX (55.3%), Naperville, IL (53.0%), Centennial, CO (52.5%), and Allen, TX (52.0%).

Utah Data

The percentage of houses in Utah with four or more bedrooms rose from 34.4% in 2000 to 39.2% in 2005. In 1990, the percentage of homes in Utah with four or more bedrooms was only 10.7%.


Among counties in Utah with populations over 65,000, Davis County (49.4%) ranked highest, followed by Utah County (45.7%), Cache County (40.9%), Salt Lake County (37.2%), Weber County (36.3%), and Washington County (26.5%).

Among cities in Utah with populations over 65,000, the city of Sandy, UT (64.6%) has the highest percentage of houses with four or more bedrooms. It was followed by Orem, UT (48.8%), West Jordan, UT (43.5%), West Valley, UT (37.3%), Ogden, UT (28.1%), Provo, UT (27.5%), and Salt Lake City, UT (19.7%).



The City Library

For more than 100 years, the Salt Lake City Public Library has been expanding your world--providing the information you need for school, work, and personal fulfillment. The Free Public Library of Salt Lake City first opened on February 14, 1898. In 2006, Library Journal selected the Salt Lake City Public Library as Library of the Year, citing it as a library "where democracy happens."

The Main Library opened in 2003 with much praise for its groundbreaking architecture. The building embodies the idea that a library is more than a repository of books and computers--it reflects and engages the city's imagination and aspirations. The six-story curving, walkable wall embraces the public plaza with local shops and services at ground level. The building offers a 300-seat auditorium and meeting rooms for community use. A rooftop garden offers a 360-degree view of the Salt Lake Valley. Special spaces inside the library have been designed for use as a teen library, children's library, technology center, and art gallery. More than 3 million people visit the Main Library annually, making it the second-biggest attraction in the State of Utah.

Each of The City Library's five branch libraries serve their communities with special features, services, and collections tailored to the neighborhood. Anderson-Foothill Library's outdoor amphitheatre and large meeting room space are ideal for community gatherings. Sprague Library, in the heart of Sugarhouse, has formed strong partnerships with local businesses. Sweet Library's family-friendly design is a comfortable venue for lifelong learning. Chapman Library in Poplar Grove features striking Carnegie Library architecture and a playful children's room. Day-Riverside Library's grounds are home to a community ecogarden that teaches organic and sustainable food production.

The City Library's collection of nearly 800,000 items represents more than 80 languages and includes materials for kids, teens, adults, and seniors, representing nearly every interest in our community. From homework help to car repair, bestselling fiction to current periodicals, classic films to today's popular music, The City Library's collection is designed to offer something for everyone. Approximately 3,500,000 items are checked out from The City Library every year, averaging 19 items per resident (twice the national average).

Beyond books, periodicals, and AV items, The City Library provides access to more than 40 online databases. These resources include Rosetta Stone Language Library (the #1 language learning tool in the world), Medline Plus (health information from the world's largest medical library), Morningstar and Value Line (investment information), Reference USA (business information), HeritageQuest Online (genealogy), EBSCOhost (journal articles) and more. Most databases to which The City Library subscribes can be accessed from home using your City Library Card.

The City Library is dedicated to providing local businesses a rich array of services. Libraries recognize the critical role literacy plays in building and maintaining a competitive business and an educated workforce. The City Library collects the best business-related books, magazines and audio-visual materials, and business-related databases. Meeting rooms are available for community and business gatherings. Computer

and technology skills courses are taught at the Main Library's Technology Center, covering everything from basic computer knowledge to using special business tools. Those who own a business in Salt Lake City but live outside the service area can apply for an Organizational City Library Card to have access to all City Library collections and services.

The City Library has earned a local and national reputation of providing forward-thinking library services to all members of the Salt Lake community. We look forward to the next opportunity we have to serve you, your organization, and your family.

The Utah State Data Center Program

In 1982 the State of Utah entered into a voluntary agreement with the U.S. Census Bureau to establish the Utah State Data Center (SDC) program. The SDC program provides training and technical assistance in accessing and using census data for research, administration, planning, and decision-making by the government, the business community, university researchers, and other interested data users.

The Governor's Office of Planning and Budget serves as the lead coordinating agency for 34 organizations in Utah that make up the Utah State, Business, and Industry Data Center (SDC/BIDC) information network. This extensive network of SDC affiliates consists of major universities, libraries, regional and local organizations, as well as government agencies that produce primary data on the Utah economy. Each of these affiliates use, and provide the public with economic, demographic, or fiscal data on Utah. The Affiliate's Corner page of the *Utah Data Guide* has been created to highlight and recognize SDC program affiliates and their great work.
