2004 Subcounty Population Estimates

Utah

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Herriman was the fastest growing city in Utah, with a growth rate of 38.5%. It was followed by Saratoga Springs (28.8%), Syracuse (13.9%), Nibley (13.6%), and Cedar Hills (13.5%).

West Jordan saw the largest numerical increase in population with an increase of 4,846 persons. It was followed by St. George (3,256), Lehi (2,583), South Jordan (2,415), and Herriman (2,176).

Salt Lake City had a population of 178,605 and continued to be the most populous city in the State of Utah. It was followed by West Valley City (112,678), Provo (99,624), Sandy (89,979), and West Jordan (89,011) which replaced Orem as the fifth highest populated city in Utah. St. George continued to climb in the ranking, moving from tenth in 2003 to ninth in 2004 with a population of 58,179.

With the release of the 2004 estimates, two of Utah's incorporated areas changed the class of city in which they were grouped. Riverton (30,119) moved up from a fourth class city to a third class city. Toquerville (1,046) moved from a town classification to a fifth class city.

Nation

According to U.S. Census Bureau population estimates for July 1, 2004, seven of the nation's top 10 fastest growing large cities (population of 100,000 or more) were in the western states of Arizona, California, and Nevada; the remaining three cities were in Florida.

Port St. Lucie, FL, had the nation's fastest growth rate (12.0%) among large cities between July 1, 2003 and July 1, 2004. It was followed by Elk Grove, CA (10.6%), North Las Vegas, NV (9.8%), Gilbert, AZ (7.7%), and Cape Coral, FL (7.6%). Rounding out the top ten fastest growing large cities were: Moreno Valley, CA; Chandler, AZ; Miramar, FL; Rancho Cucamonga, CA; and Roseville, CA.

Phoenix had the largest numerical population increase between 2003 and 2004, adding 29,826 people. Los Angeles (26,128), San Antonio (22,095), Las Vegas (17,923) and Fort Worth, Texas (17,872) rounded out the list of the five largest numerical gains.

New York City continued to be the nation's most populous city, with 8.1 million residents. This is more than twice the population of Los Angeles, which ranked second at 3.8 million, followed by Chicago (2.9 million), Houston (2.0 million) and Philadelphia (1.5 million).

2005 Baseline Subcounty Projections

The Governor's Office of Planning and Budget and the seven Associations of Government in Utah recently released population projections for Utah's cities and unincorporated areas. These are consistent with the county projections that were produced and released by the Governor's Office of Planning and Budget (GOPB) in January 2005. GOPB coordinated the effort by providing data, technical assistance, and general guidelines for the work. The current series is a revision of the sub-county population projections that were produced in 2002.

State and County Population Projections

Utah's population, which was 2.2 million in 2000, is projected to reach 5.4 million in 2050. The average annual rate of change from 2000 to 2050 is 1.8%, well above the national average of 0.8%.

Utah's counties will experience various levels of growth. High growth is projected to be concentrated in counties within or adjacent to the northern metropolitan region, and in the southwestern portion of the state. The county that will have the fastest growing average annual rate of change during the projections period is Washington County (3.9%), it will be closely followed by Morgan (3.8%), Summit (3.0%), Wasatch (2.9%) and Tooele (2.9%). Other counties that will grow at a faster rate than the state's rate of 1.8% are Utah, Iron, Cache and Beaver.

Several counties are projected to experience gains in population of above 100,000 persons. The county that will experience the highest gain is Utah County which will see growth of over three-quarters of a million people (775,439). It will be followed by Salt Lake (761,217), Washington (516,230), Davis (183,973), Cache (174,814), Weber (173,888), Tooele (106,937), and Summit (102,633).

It is projected that several counties will experience average annual growth of less than 1.0% during the projections period. The majority of these counties are located in the central and eastern areas of the state. They are Sevier (0.9%), Rich (0.7%), Piute (0.7%), Daggett (0.7%), San Juan (0.6%), Carbon (0.6%), Emery (0.6%), Uintah (0.5%) and Grand (0.4%). No county will experience negative growth.

Subcounty Population Projections

Many of Utah's cities will experience significant growth over the projections period, like the counties, this growth will be in the northern metropolitan region and in the southwestern portion of the state. In fact, it is projected that the 30 fastest growing cities (with a population of over 1,000 on April 1, 2000) will all be located either on the Wasatch Front or in Washington County.

Of the cities that had a population of over 1,000 in the 2000 Census, Saratoga Springs in Utah County is projected to experience the fastest growth during the projections period. This city will grow at an average annual rate of 8.7%, nearly five times faster than the state as a whole. It will be followed by Eagle Mountain in Utah County (7.5%), Herriman in Salt Lake County (7.3%), Bluffdale in Salt Lake County (5.1%) and Santaquin in Utah County (4.6%).

St. George in Washington County will experience the largest numerical increase, growing from 50,000 in 2000, to 317,800 in 2050, an increase of over 267,700 people. Other cities that are projected to experience large growth are West Jordan in Salt Lake County (102,700), Eagle Mountain in Utah County (98,100), Lehi in Utah County (95,400), and South Jordan in Salt Lake County (82,800).

This growth will drastically change the face of Utah's metropolitan areas. St. George is projected to replace Salt Lake City as the largest city in Utah, moving from being the tenth largest city in 2000, to the largest in 2050. This change will make Salt Lake City the second largest city in Utah, followed by West Jordan, which in 2000 was the sixth largest. The fourth largest city will be West Valley, followed by Provo, Sandy, Orem and Logan.

Minority and Women Owned Businesses



According to new tabulations titled Preliminary Estimates of Business Ownership by Gender, Hispanic or Latino Origin, minority groups and women are increasing their business ownership at a much higher rate than both the national average and the state average in Utah. These tabulations are from the recently released U.S. Census Bureau's

2002 Survey of Business Owners (SBO).

National Highlights

There were 23 million businesses in the U.S. in 2002, a 10.4% increase from 1997. However, the rate of growth for minority- and women-owned businesses was far higher, beginning with the 66.7% growth for native Hawaiian- and other Pacific islander-owned businesses. It was followed by black-owned businesses (45.5%), Hispanic-owned businesses (31.2%), and Asian-owned businesses (23.7%). There were 206,125 American Indian- and Alaska native-owned businesses in 2002; however, due to differences in the 1997 and 2002 questionnaires, prior data for this group are not directly comparable. There were 6.5 million women-owned businesses in 2002, a 19.9% increase from 1997.

Utah Highlights

The number of businesses in Utah increased by 14.1% between

1997 and 2002 to 193,013 firms; this is above the national level of 10.4%. The rate of growth for minority- and women- owned businesses was higher than the state average for every group except Hispanic-owned businesses. Black- or African-American owned businesses recorded the greatest growth, increasing by 47.5% to 649 firms. It was followed by Native Hawaiian- and other Pacific Islander-owned businesses (44.9%), Asian-owned businesses increased (35.6%) and Hispanic-owned businesses increased by (9.2%). There were 1,148 businesses owned by American Indian- and Alaska-Native in 2002.

The greatest numerical increase was experienced by Asian-owned businesses. The number of businesses owned by Asians in 1997 was 2,082; in 2002 it was 2,824, representing an increase of nearly 750 businesses. It was followed by Hispanic-owned businesses (438), black- or African American-owned businesses (209) and those owned by Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islanders (133).

The number of women-owned businesses in Utah increased by 15.5% to 48,484. This represents an increase of 6,493 businesses. Women-owned businesses made up 25.1% of all firms in Utah in 2002, a slight increase from 1997, when they made up 24.8% of all businesses.

2005 Kids Count Data Book



The *2005 Kids Count Data Book*, prepared by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, provides state profiles of child well-being. The report includes data on children in Utah and how they rank with other children in the United States. All rankings are most favorable (1) to least favorable (50). In nine of the ten categories, Utah children fair better than the national average. The key indicators of child well-being are listed below.

Percent of low-birthweight babies are the percentage of live births weighing less than 2,500 grams (5.5 pounds). Causes for low-birth weight babies include maternal age, race or ethnicity, multiple gestation, low pre-pregnancy weight, tobacco use during pregnancy, and lack of prenatal care. In 2002, 6.4% of live births in Utah were low-birthweight babies, ranking the state 9th best in the nation, while the U.S. had an average rate of 7.8%.

Infant mortality rate is the number of deaths occurring to infants under one year of age per 1,000 live births. Utah ranks 9th in this category with a rate of 5.6, compared to 7.0 for the nation.

Child death rate is the number of deaths from all causes per 100,000 children between ages 1 and 14. Utah ranks near the middle in this category with a rate of 23 per 1,000, which is higher than the national average of 21.


Rate of teen death from all causes is the number of deaths from accidents, homicides, and suicides to teens between ages 15 and 19, per 100,000 teens in this age group. Utah continues to rank near the middle in the category with a ranking of 19th and a rate of 65 per 100,000, compared to the U.S. average of 68.

Teen birth rate is the number of births to teenagers between ages 15 and 17 per 1,000 females in this age group. This measure of teenage childbearing focuses on the fertility of all girls ages 15 to 17, regardless of marital status. The Kids Count Data Book focuses on births from 15 to 17 year-olds, rather than the broader age range of 15 to 19 year-olds, because of a strong consensus that births to girls at the younger ages are more problematic. Utah continues to have a lower rate than the nation as a whole, with 18 per 1,000 in the 15 to 17 age group, compared to 23 for the U.S.

Percent of teens who are high school dropouts is the percentage of teenagers between ages 16 and 19 who are not enrolled in school and do not have a high school degree, GED or equivalent. Utah ranks 10th best in this category with a rate of 6% compared to 8% in the U.S. As the demographics change in Utah, there is a challenge for all children to receive a quality education before they enter their adult years.

Percent of teens not attending school and not working is the percentage of teenagers between ages 16 and 19 who are not enrolled in school (full or part-time) and not employed (full or part-time). This measure is sometimes referred to as "Idle Teens." Utah ranked 16th in this category in 2003 with a rate of 8%, compared to 9% in the U.S.

Percent of children living in families where no parent has full-time, year-round employment is the share of all children under 18 living in families where parents do not have regular, secure employment. With 26% of Utah's children falling into this category, the state received the rank of 4th best in 2003. The national average was 33%.



2005 Kids Count Data Book

Percent of children in poverty is the share of children under age 18 who live in families with incomes below the U.S. poverty threshold, as defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget. The federal poverty level for a family of four in 2000 was \$17,463. In 2003, 12% of Utah's children fell into this category ranking the state 5th best among the states. The U.S. had a child poverty rate of 18%.

Percent of children in single-parent households is the percentage of children under age 18 who live in a household headed by a person (male or female) without a spouse present in the home. Utah ranks the as the best in the nation in this category with 17%

of children falling into this category, compared to the U.S. with 30% of children living in single-parent households.

Kids Count overall ranking uses a consistent set of indicators for each state. Overall, Utah ranked 9th in child well-being among the states in the *2005 Kids Count Data Book*. It should be noted that the indicators used in the Kids Count Data Books have changed over time, making year-to-year comparisons of state ranks problematic. Overall ranks are the best source of information to see whether a particular state improved in ranking over the past few years. Affiliates Corner: Utah Office of Ethnic Affairs



The Utah Office of Ethnic Affairs is housed within the newly created Department of Community and Culture as of July 1, 2005. As a division for the Department of Community and Culture, the State Office of Ethnic Affairs reports to the Executive Director of this department.

Background:

In the previous structure, the ethnic offices operated as independent silos and reported to the Housing and Community Development Division, which was under the Department of Community & Economic Development. Under the new structure, the Office of Ethnic Affairs reports to the Executive Director of the Department of Community and Culture.

Mission:

The mission of the Office of Ethnic Affairs (OEA) is to ensure that Utah state government adequately meets the needs of the ethnic community. The Office fulfills its mission through its partnerships with sister-state agencies in promoting institutional change to assure equity and access to quality cultural-competent programs and services.

Structure:

The Office of Ethnic Affairs has a director who oversees the entire office, and ethnic directors representing the Asian, Black, Hispanic/Latino and Pacific Islander communities. In addition, there is a director for public and policy research. The remaining staff consists of a special projects coordinator, a community outreach coordinator, and three administrative assistants.

Public Policy and Research

The Office of Ethnic Affairs conducts analysis of ethnic data, legislative issues, and provides fact sheets on Utah's ethnic communities. OEA also provides access to reports about Utah's minority population that were written by other departments or organizations.

Services to the Public:

With its partnerships with other state agencies, the Office of Ethnic Affairs coordinates projects and events targeted at improving the quality of services and outreach to the ethnic community.

The Office assists constituents of the different ethnic communities by providing referrals as they seek services in state government. The Office of Ethnic Affairs also provides a culturally competent and user-friendly web site for the public to access various resources and information.

To improve the communication mechanisms between state government and the public, OEA assists with the coordination of ongoing news conferences with the ethnic media where issues of discussion focus on Utah's ethnic community.

Services to the State Agencies:

In order to assure that all state services and programs are accessible to all Utahns, the Office of Ethnic Affairs provides cultural competence consultation to state departments, reviews their policies, practices, procedures, and ensures proper outreach and response to the ethnic community.

The Office of Ethnic Affairs promotes policies that support attitudes, behaviors, knowledge and skills necessary for staff to work respectfully and effectively in a culturally diverse society as models for the entire government system.

Web Site:

The Utah Office of Ethnic Affairs' website serves as a diverse resource for the community and government agencies.

Some features include: Public Policy and Research, a Community Resources section, Ethnic Directories, Events Calendar, and an On-line Subscription to weekly announcements.

The Public Policy and Research section provides access to data and fact sheets related to the ethnic community.

In 1982 the State of Utah entered into a voluntary agreement with the U.S. Census Bureau to establish the Utah State Data Center (SDC) program. The SDC program provides training and technical assistance in accessing and using census data for research, administration, planning, and decision-making by the government, the business community, university researchers, and other interested data users.

The Governor's Office of Planning and Budget serves as the lead coordinating agency for 35 organizations in Utah that make up the Utah State, Business, and Industry Data Center (SDC/BIDC) information network. This extensive network of SDC affiliates consists of major universities, libraries, regional and local organizations, as well as government agencies that produce primary data on the Utah economy. Each of these affiliates use, and provide the public with economic, demographic, or fiscal data on Utah.
