At the PRADA meeting held November 6, 2013, UDC/IPP was tasked to gather information regarding Contract County Facilities.

100 Tooele (50 male/50 female in the existing facility. No build.) Needs Resolution
168 Uintah (In the existing facility. No build.) Currently under Contract

EXISTING/PROJECTED GROWTH

During November 2013, IPP contacted each of the Contract County Facilities and the two other jails interested in contracting and requested available bed numbers for existing facilities. Appendix 1 provides a chart indicating the projected growth for state inmate beds through FY20. The information for this chart was provided by UDC Research and Planning. It is anticipated the available beds in existing Contract County Facilities would be able to absorb the anticipated growth in state inmate beds until the opening of CUCF West One in February/March 2017.

Also provided in Appendix 1 is a document outlining current beds, FY14 additional offered beds, and indicates those numbers and types/classification of beds. Facilities highlighted in blue indicate a UDC security review is needed prior to contracting. The available beds highlighted in red indicate a Legislative Resolution is needed. A summary of the additional available beds is included in Appendix 2.

BACKGROUND

Currently the Utah Department of Corrections (UDC) contracts with 21 county jails throughout the State of Utah, (see Appendix 3). Appendix 3 indicates the Contract County Facility, current contracted beds, bed funding available and bonded status. Bonded facilities will be indicated in text and the dark color of the bubble. Bonded means UDC supported the Bond by indicating the intent to use beds for housing of state inmates by contract. Two county jails, not currently under contract, indicate interest in contracting for state inmate beds.

When UDC contracting with the county jails began it was a very small program contracting only a small number of beds. Currently 2167 beds are contracted with funding for 1706. The criterion for inmates to be housed in a county jail has been revised over the years in order to provide referrals/inmates for the increased contract numbers. As contract numbers continue to increase the criteria will need to change to provide enough inmates to fill the beds.

Currently four (4) Contract County Facilities provide UDC approved Substance Abuse Programming. An additional Contract County Facility has a UDC approved Substance Abuse Program however, UDC does not track or pay for the state inmates participating. This program is mainly for their county inmates and state inmates participate only when there is a seat available. Two (2) Contract County Facilities provide UDC approved Sex Offender Treatment, (see Appendix 4). You will also find a document indicating number of beds available for each program as well as classes offered at all Contract County Facilities.

To provide useful information regarding the mileage between the prison sites and each of the Contract County Facilities Appendix 5 was developed.

Total beds currently available in the county jails that meets UDC needs is 2223. Subtracting our current funded beds leaves 527 additional available beds. Emery, Grand, Iron, Tooele & Weber - Resolution needed for additional beds. Davis, Garfield, Kane & Washington additional offered beds do not meet UDC needs.

The 108 in FY 17 is due to CUCF's West One coming online potentially in March.

* The remaining 131 beds available at County Jail after FY17 does not take into consideration County inmate bed growth.

* It is important to note that the classification of inmates may not meet the available beds being offered. For example:

Davis and Washington Counties additional offered beds are determined to be minimum security beds and will not meet UDC's current needs.

* Garfield & Kane Counties offer an additional six beds however, this would take them to bed capacity and County inmate growth may create the need to reduce state inmate beds.

UDC is Reviewing County Jail Screening Criteria

* UDC is working with Davis and Weber Counties to pilot a change of the County Jails medical acuity to a M2 status. This would provide more inmates available for referral as these facilities could house inmates with higher medical needs.

* UDC is reviewing the possibility of another pilot program with Cache, Davis and Weber Counties for the housing of long term and Loss of Life inmates. UDC is looking at the size of the facility, their response teams, medical services and overall security.

APPENDIX 2

AVAILABLE BEDS – FY14

UDC appreciates all the Contract County Facilities and values the partnerships we have. As UDC reviews these additional available beds, the type of bed needs to be considered and a determination made as to whether or not they will meet UDC's bed needs for the housing of state inmates.

Available beds may fluctuate as well as county populations increase and decrease. For example, November 2013, Wasatch County had a sudden and unforeseen increase in their female population which caused their request to remove 16 female state inmates. Two weeks later they are able to bring back eight (8) of those beds.

DAVIS

Davis is offering an additional 50 mostly minimum security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing. Minimum security beds are not the type of beds UDC currently needs.

EMERY

Emery is offering 10 new medium security beds for the housing of state inmates. Emery is not currently under contract with UDC for the housing of state inmates. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract these new beds. A UDC security review would also need to be completed to ensure staffing levels; security levels etc. meet UDC standards for the housing of state inmates.

GARFIELD

Garfield is offering an additional four (4) medium security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing. UDC concerns with these additional four (4) beds as they may be short term beds due to county inmate count fluctuation and operational capacity for the jail facility.

GRAND

Grand is offering an additional 10 medium security beds of the same gender. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing.

IRON

Iron is offering an additional 25 medium & minimum security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing.

KANE

Kane is offering an additional six (6) medium security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing. UDC concerns with these additional six (6) beds as they may be short term beds due to county inmate count fluctuation and operational capacity for the jail facility.

TOOELE

Tooele is offering 100 new maximum and medium security beds for the housing of state inmates. These beds are broken down as 50 beds for male inmates and 50 beds for female inmates. Tooele is not currently under contract with UDC for the housing of state inmates. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract these new beds. A UDC security review would also need to be completed to ensure staffing levels; security levels etc. meet UDC standards for the housing of state inmates.


WASHINGTON

Washington is offering an additional 34 minimum security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing. Minimum security beds are not the type of beds UDC currently needs.

WEBER

Weber is offering an additional 100 medium security beds. These beds would be in their current, already constructed building. An approved Legislative Resolution is needed in order for UDC to contract the additional beds for state inmate housing.
