

ADDENDUM A

Addendum A was prepared in August 2013 to more clearly reflect the fact that Kane County was undergoing a jail expansion at the time of the 2011 survey (as reflected in Table 10 of the Study), and that its expansion numbers were not included in Kane County's response to that survey. However, Kane County's expansion numbers were included in all other aspects of the report prepared for the Utah Association of Counties and the report fully reflects all jail beds for all of the counties.

In order to assist the counties in assessing where there is available capacity to house State inmates, Kane County's updated (2012-2013) figures have been included in the following table. However, it is important to note that this table now contains the original data from the counties for 2011, but data from Kane County for 2012 and 2013.
