NOTICE

A notice of intent for the following project submitted in accordance with §R307-401-1, Utah Administrative Code (UAC), has been received for consideration by the Executive Secretary, Utah Air Quality Board:

Hoyt USA

Location: 543 North Neil Armstrong Road, Salt Lake City, UT 84116

Project Description: Hoyt USA manufactures archery equipment and they replaced the Camouflage Paint Spray Booth with a Germat paint booth. The Camouflage paint booth was larger than the Germat paint booth and had a natural gas fired curing oven. The Germat paint booth does not have a curing oven. Hoyt USA has a parts washer in their maintenance department. The parts washer is a Kleen-Tec Model 1030, 30-gallon parts washer. Hoyt is listing the dip process tanks and two vacuum pumps for clarification. The tanks were originally included with the Camouflage Paint Process and the emissions associated with the tanks were included with the Camouflage Paint Process emissions. Hoyt USA is located in Salt Lake County, which is a nonattainment area of the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) for PM₁₀ and SO₂, and is a maintenance area for CO and Ozone. New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) and National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) regulations do not apply to this source. Title V of the 1990 Clean Air Act does not apply to this source. There will be increase in emissions as a result of this modification.

Growth factors used in the State Implementation Plan(s) for Salt Lake County have taken emission increases for this type of proposal into account.

The completed engineering evaluation and air quality impact analysis showed that the proposed project meets the requirements of federal air quality regulations and the State air quality rules. The Executive Secretary intends to issue an Approval Order pending a 30-day public comment period. The project proposal, estimate of the effect on local air quality and draft Approval Order are available for public inspection and comment at the Utah Division of Air Quality, 150 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City, UT84114-4820. Written Comments received by the Division at this same address on or before August 3, 2004, will be considered in making the final decision on the approval/disapproval of the proposed approval order. Email comments will also be accepted at nmeli@utah.gov. If anyone so requests to the Executive Secretary at the Division in writing within 15 days of publication of this notice, a hearing will be held in accordance with R307-401-4, UAC.
